# Saco Lodge No. 9 2005

At the Annual Meeting in January 2005, Wor. Gregory Milliken was elected to his second term as Master, His first being in 1983. Making it over twenty years between his time in the East. In fact, this was the greatest amount of time between sitting in the East. The previous record was 17 years when RW Richard Clark sat in the East in 1997. One other piece of trivia, only seven masters of Saco Lodge have served multiple non consecutive terms, while 35 have served consecutive years.

### **Meetings**

Prior to the installation of Officers on January 15th, we dedicated our new By-Laws. Brother Thomas Magadieu had them leather bound with gold leaf edges. Wor. Carl Marsano gave a short talk on the history of the By-Laws, and why we dedicated them to MW Edward P. Burnham, PGM. After the talk, all of the officers signed the new By-Laws of Saco Lodge.

The Installation of Officers was well attended including several potential candidates. A buffet lunch was served following the installation, and the Victory Swing Band provided musical entertainment.

Our first meeting after installation was a special meeting on January 27, 2005. Work of the evening was a Fellowcraft Degree on Brother Andrew Morgan.

On February 24<sup>th</sup> we had a special scheduled for the purpose of another Fellowcraft Degree on two candidates. Due to work conflicts, we found ourselves without any candidates for the Fellowcraft Degree, but in attendance that night was Brother Andrew Morgan who was passed the month before. Brother Andrew was ready and passed his proficiency, so we proceeded to raise that brother, basically changing the degree of the night on a moments notice. Our ability to change from doing one degree to another without practice, and do it well, indicates that the Officers of Saco Lodge have gained a depth of knowledge of Ritual and Degree work previously unrecorded in the annals of Saco Lodge. We intend to maintain and build on this where we are deficient.

Also, in February we held a bonfire at the Milliken farm, as a time of fellowship. Our families and friends were there. We did not have much luck in getting the fire going, but a good time was held by all.



On March 5<sup>th</sup> we held a game room clean up and Masonic Ritual Study day. We had several brother show up, and after some hard work, the game room is to the point of where we can once again use the pool table and the stick rack is hung up on the wall.

March 26<sup>th</sup>, saw Wor. Greg, Wor. Carl Marsano and Bro. Elliott Hazelrig at a one day school of instruction, held by the 19<sup>th</sup> Masonic District. The school was given by RW Stephen Nichols, the Grand Lecturer. This session was very informative and was better attended than having separate days of instruction. It is hoped that the 18<sup>th</sup> District will do this in the near future.

Instead of presenting our 50 year veterans with fruit baskets around Christmas Time, this year we presented them each with "fixins" for a ham dinner at Easter. This was well received by the brethren and it is our hope that this will become a tradition.

Heeding the Most Worshipful Grand Master's call to raise three brethren on April 16<sup>th</sup>, Saco Lodge pursued this event with zeal and planned accordingly. Letters were sent to area lodges asking if they would like to participate in the event. Arion Lodge of Goodwin's Mills rose to the occasion accepted our invitation and brought three candidates of their own!

Before the degree work started, Saco Lodge presented their Community Betterment Grant to the Saco Food Pantry. Since the fire that burned down the First Congregational Church several years ago, the Saco Food Pantry has moved from place to place using donated vacant space, but having to move each time a paying tenant was found. They looked for a more permanent home. The pantry borrowed money to purchase a building and want to pay off the loan as soon as possible, so funds can be best used for feeding the hungry. Saco's Master, Greg Milliken presented a check for \$1,000 to Wor. Bryce Milne, a Past Master from that other jurisdiction (Massachusetts).



On that day, four brethren were Raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason. Saco Lodge didn't make the goal of three for that day due to scheduling conflicts but we did raise three for the month of April. This work was highlighted in the Maine Mason Magazine in the fall.

Wor. Gregory Milliken, VW Joel Tripp and Br. Steven Boucouvalas attended the Grand Lodge session at Husson College in Bangor.





Worshipful Ronald Tripp, PM 1958, 1959, Worshipful Millard Tripp, PM 1964 and long time Secretary, and Worshipful Forrest Tripp, PM. 2000 were honored, and were presented red Saco Lodge No. 9 golf shirts. Red was chosen, to signify their hard work in another Masonic body, York Chapter No. 5. The fourth toast was to the honorees and their family members, instead of the Wardens.


Greg Milliken on the Camera with Joel's son Forrest Tripp holding the microphone



Child Safety Days at Home Depot in Biddeford

Thanks to the efforts of Wor. David Perkins, Saco Lodge No. 9 is participating in the "Adopt A Road" program with the City of Saco. After some deliberation, the lodge selected Jenkins Road which runs parallel with the Maine Turnpike. The City of Saco acknowledged our efforts (See letter from Mayor in appendix) and has posted a sign on Jenkins Road. The City of Saco supplies trash bags, gloves and safety vests, and expects us to hold at least three cleanups per year. In June, David and his wife, his son, Brother Eric Perkins and his wife, Brother Jeffrey Robinson and Worshipful Carl Marsano participated in the first cleanup. In October, we conducted another cleanup.

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, the Lodge attended Saint John's Sunday at the North Saco Congregational Church with Rev. Dr. Bruce Bumbaum as Pastor. VW Joel Tripp spoke briefly about why we were present. Wor. Greg did the call to worship, prayer approach and lead the Lord's Prayer. Pastor Bumbaum's father is a Mason and he was in De Molay as a boy.



We continued our work throughout the summer, marking the third consecutive summer where we did not go dark. During this summer, we held our annual outdoor degree which was also our annual inspection at the Marland Milliken Memorial Field. A map was email to all those involved. Arion Lodge supplied the candidate for the degree, since none of Saco's candidates were ready for the degree. Once again, a dispensation from Grand Lodge was granted.
