#### **Meetings**

Installation of officers took place on January 17<sup>th</sup>, with Wor. Forrest Tripp once again installing his son as Master. Joel then installed the remaining officers with Wor Carl Marsano as Installing Chaplain. The Installation of Officers was well attended including several potential candidates. Joel outlined goals for the year including completion of the By-laws revision, CHIPs programs for the year, raising a number of candidates and fellowship nights throughout the year.

Inspection was held in February to help balance the District Deputy's schedule. Normally they would be in the fall, and the DDGM would have to do 10 inspections in a short time of three months. The degree performed was the Master Mason degree on Bro. Keith Shirley. We received very good marks for the work completed from the DDGM, RW Gerald "Butch" Gannett. This is now the highest we can receive with Grand Lodge eliminating the excellent designation.

At the March Stated Meeting, we had a request to do two courtesy degrees for an Entered Apprentice from Tennessee who was shipping out from Brunswick Naval Air Station. After having obtained a dispensation from MW Charles Ridlon, who rapidly granted the dispensation, Brother Elliott Hazlerig was Passed to the Degree of a Fellow Craft on March 5<sup>th</sup>. He was Raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason on March 9<sup>th</sup>. Brother Elliott actually learned his Fellow Craft lesson in four days. Brother Elliott shipped out on Thursday March 11<sup>th</sup> for an assignment in the Caribbean.

We continued to have a busy spring with eight Entered Apprentice degrees taking place during April and May. We hosted our annual Widow's Night in April, having a Barbershop Quartet doing the entertainment.

We also, for the first time greeted RW Robert Varnum as the DDGM for the 18<sup>th</sup> Masonic District. Later that month, on May 26<sup>th</sup> we conducted two Entered Apprentice Degrees. A day later we hosted a Ritual School of Instruction on the Fellow Craft Degree.

During June, Saco Lodge performed a Fellow Craft Degree at the Stated Meeting and Brother Gordon Workman was Raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason. Also, at the Master Mason

Degree, we received a contingent of Prince Hall Masons from Massachusetts including a Past Grand Master, PGM Nicholas Locker of JJ Smith Lodge #14 and Prince Hall Representative to England, Other brothers from Rising Sun Lodge No. 3 and Mt. #### **Grand Lodge Officers**






Before and During Construction Pictures

## **Bylaws**

In February, Wor Joel and Wor Carl Marsano rewrote the bylaws of Saco Lodge with the goal of simplifying them to prevent rewriting every few years to account for changes in dues or life memberships. Key changes included having the finance committee serve separate three-year terms to promote stability and to limit membership to serving only two consecutive three-year terms. Another change was to link the life membership to IRS actuarial tables, current dues and present interest rates. These were presented to the membership in March and voted on in April. Grand Lodge approved these during the summer, and they were formally presented to the lodge at the January 2005 Installation.
